At DOE Headquarters, in the event of a lapse of appropriations and the exhaustion of available balances, a small staff in the following offices would provide support to portions of DOE that perform functions related to the safety of human life or the protection of property:

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The National Nuclear Security Administration would perform functions related to the safety of human life and the protection of property in three main program areas: maintenance and safeguarding of nuclear weapons; international non-proliferation activities; and servicing deployed naval reactors. Within the weapons programs, excepted personnel will have oversight concerning stopping or maintaining critical control operations systems that involve nuclear materials or maintenance of one-of-a-kind equipment in order to make shutdown decisions.

Bonneville Power Administration is self-funding under a permanent, indefinite appropriation and will continue to operate normally (3,099 FTE). The other Power Marketing Administrations (Southeastern Power Administration, Southwestern Power Administration, Western Area Power Administration) will perform functions related to the safety of human life and the protection of property by engaging in controlling and directing power to utilities, transmission of power, and repair of the power transmission system. Bonneville Power Administration employees are included in the number of employees whose compensation is financed by a resource other than annual appropriations.

Employees performing work funded by multi-year appropriations would remain working after available balances from DOE's base appropriations are exhausted. DOE has received multi-year appropriations through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). As of August 4, 2023, 1,040 DOE employees were fully or partially funded by multi-year appropriations; these employees would continue to perform funded work after the exhaustion of DOE base funding.

Brief summary of significant agency activities that will cease during a lapse:

After the exhaustion of available balances, those activities not related to the preservation of life and property, unnecessary to the discharge of the President's constitutional power, not funded by other than annual appropriations, or not otherwise expressly authorized by law will cease.
